



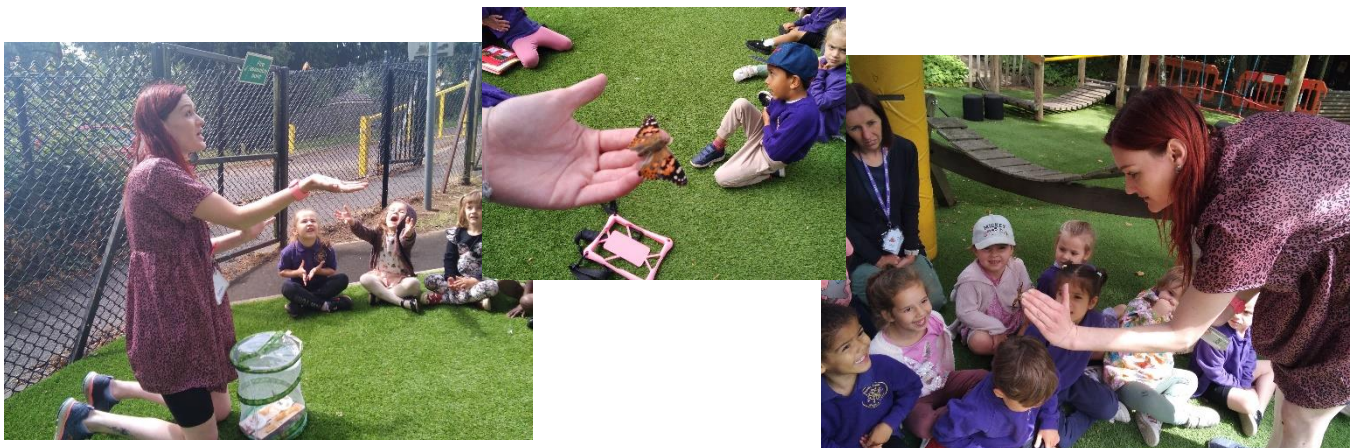
Newsletter 1st July 2022
