

Information in response to frequently asked questions asked this week

- Children will not be in their key groups but will be in 'bubbles' of children, possibly 10 / 13 to a bubble who will be allocated to consistent adults
- We currently anticipate that there may be two 'bubbles' to ensure that we can meet the government guidance.
- The guidance has acknowledged that children this age will not be able to socially distance. However, the two 'bubbles' of children will socially distance from each other
- Staff will only wear masks/ PPE when changing children or should they become unwell
- We will have a dedicated, marked out area for each 'bubble' with toys/ equipment for that 'bubble' of children that will be thoroughly cleaned after each 'bubble' of children go home and before a new 'bubble' of children come in
- Children will wash their hands when they enter the nursery building and then at set points throughout the session/day
- Hand sanitiser will be available at all times
- If children become unwell while they are at school, they will be separated from their 'bubble', sent home and will be expected to isolate for 14 days or until test is proved as negative
- If children/staff test positive all children will be informed and will also isolate for 14 days and guidance will be obtained from PHE as to closing the school
- Parents will not be allowed to enter the school building and we will have a one way system drop off in operation through the outside area. There will be 2metre signs displayed and we will ask parents to wait and stagger the entrance and collection times
- We will be mindful of when to use physical contact. However, we will be supporting children with toileting and reassuring / soothing/ comforting them when they are hurt or upset as we normally would with physical contact
- Children will not be using book bags and we will not be sending story sacks/busy finger packs home
